#### **General Notes**

As much as we can do to stop them, we acknowledge there will always be instances out of our control - ie risk of people falling and hurting themselves.

Provision has been made to allow the easy access of emergency vehicles.

First Aid and telephone provision is provided in the Entrance Building.

Members of staff to be updated in First Aid and Health & Safety issues and courses attended as applicable. Staff will be encouraged to act on or report any potential problems to management.

Staff to ensure they have had up to date Tetanus vaccinations

Books/leaflets/advice on Risk Assessment, Health & Safety etc will be gleaned from the Health & Safety Executive, Police, Fire etc as appropriate.

Health and Safety information detailing risks, clothing etc will be made available prior to school visits.

First Aid boxes will be regularly checked.

Contingency Plan prepared detailing staff medical notes, telephone numbers etc.

Accident Book to be kept.

Electrics and electrical equipment to be regularly maintained.

Staff must never deal with 'distressed' or 'difficult' visitors alone; senior help must be sought

#### **Young Person's Risk Assessment**

This is incorporated into the main Risk Assessment.

A young worker is someone who has not yet attained 18 years of age. Young workers include full and part-time employees and those undergoing training or work experience.

Young workers are recognised to be at increased risk of injury because of their immaturity and inexperience, which may consequentially lead to a lack of awareness of risks. In addition, Young Workers may be physically immature which may make them more prone to injuries from lifting and handling.

<u>Control</u> – the risks noted in this Risk Assessment also apply to young workers. Management will pay particular attention to the level of information, instructions and health and safety training provided to the young person. The level of supervision provided to a young person may need to be greater, particularly where they are undertaking tasks with a risk of injury. Where the risk of injury to the young person from a work task is significant, this task will be prohibited.
